The IFBB is pleased to be active in all these areas in the strong belief that physical health is a great contribution from sport to society.



IFBB CATEGORIES



Fitness Challenge

Fitness Challenge, the new IFBB category.

This new category includes different physical exercises to display the athletic ability of athletes, and it's destined to have great success in gym competitions, and in major international events.

The event consists in a circuit of six stations (exercises), in which the competitors perform as much repetitions as they can in a 2 minutes session, of each exercise, making a competition of excellent visual impact, full of emotions, and great dynamism, in which athletes may compete individually, by couples, or by teams (6 persons per team).

A new initiative of the International Federation, with an already excellent implementation and popularity in all over the world.



Men Fitness

This sport discipline is similar in structure to Women Fitness; however the body mass is limited according to the formulas established for all four body height ranges: 170 cm, 175 cm, 180 cm and over 180 cm. Currently, there is one open Men's Fitness category.

The contest also includes four rounds, with the artistic fitness routine in Round 1 and Round 3 plus quarter turns in Round 2 and Round 4. During the quarter turns competitors wear the swim trunks only and the judges assess the overall male athletic physiques. Posing routines should include strength and flexibility moves, gymnastic moves or other ways of displaying of their athletic talent and capacity.

At the end, the subscores from two final rounds (Round 3 and Round 4) are added to produce the final scores and to reach the final places of the top 6 competitors. Competitors in places from 7th to 15th remain with their scores from the Prejudging (Round 1 and Round 2).





Women's Wellness Fitness

The Wellness Fitness division is intended for women who prefer a muscular physique without muscle separation, athletic and aesthetically pleasing, with a bigger body mass than in Bikini Fitness. From this point of view, Wellness Fitness is placed somewhere between Bikini Fitness and Women's Physique.

Assessing of the physique, judging criteria and rounds are the same like Women's Bikini Fitness. Competitors performs quarter turns in all rounds plus individual "I-walking" presentation in the finals. Vertical proportions (legs to upper body length) are ones of the key factors. Horizontal proportions (hips and waist to shoulder width) may favour women with a bit bigger hips, thighs and buttocks. There are four Wellness Fitness categories: up to 158 cm, up to 163 cm; up to 168 cm and over 168 cm.

Fit-Pairs

Fit-Pairs is the latest IFBB sport division, introduced in 2020 and approved by the IFBB International Congress. It is devoted for Women's Bikini athletes and Men's Physique competitors to create for them the possibility to perform as a couple. Fit-Pairs athletes don't perform poses like in Mixed-Pairs division and there is no posing routines. They display their physiques, body lines and body quality by performing four quarter turns. Men from the Fit-Pairs perform the Quarter Turns in the same manner like in Men's Physique, while women perform these turns in the same style like in Women's Bikini. Men competitors will wear the same attire like in Men's Physique, Women competitors will wear the same attire like in Women's Bikini. The judge will assess each Fit-Pair as an entity. Those whose physiques match, harmonize, and complement each other will receive higher places than Fit-Pairs whose physiques are markedly dissimilar and unbalanced, as would be the case of a tall ectomorphic man and a short mesomorphic woman, or vice versa. In the Finals, Fit-Pairs perform also I-walking presentation, lasting no longer than 20 seconds, and then four Quarter Turns.

Athletic Fitness

The lineup is composed by 15 athletes, in a sports discipline that combines various elements of strength, endurance as well as balanced physique. The event is composed by Rounds:

- Round 1 (Physique Round; Quarter Turns).
- Round 2 (Strength Round: Pullups and Dips).
- Round 3 (Endurance Round: Ergometer rowing).
- · Finals Round 4 (Physique Round: Ouarter Turns).
- Finals Round 5 (Strength Round).
- · Finals Round 6 (Endurance Round).



Women Acrobatic Fitness

In Women Acrobatc Fitness, the emphasis is placed on a shapely, athletic-looking physique, assessed by comparisons of four quarter turns and athletic ability, assessed during a very attractive and dynamic fitness style routine. We are looking to a physique following the bodyfitness standard criteria and also quarters are done like this modality.

Each judge will assess the routine looking for competitors who perform strength and flexibility moves, as well as acrobatic elements The routine may include aerobics, dance, gymnastics, acrobatics or other demonstrations of athletic talent with harmonized costume, music and choreography. There are no required moves

As it is a physique sport as well, there are also two physique assessment rounds beside this artistic routine rounds. In Round 1 and 3 competitors perform four quarter turns in bikini suit, during which the judges assess their figures and body contours, bodypart shape, bodyfat level, body firmness and muscle tone, overall stage presentation (self-confidence, poise, coordination of movements) as well as the overall style of presentation.





Women Artistic Fitness

For Women Artistic Fitness, In general, the assessment of women's physique is based on the same criteria like in Women's Bikini; using the same quarter posing style. So judges are looking for presentation of a balanced, proportionally and symmetrically developed, complete physique; the condition of the skin and the skin tone; and the athlete's ability to present herself with confidence, poise and grace.

Each judge will assess the routine focusing on artistic expression in dance-like choreography with diversified tempo, some strength and flexibility elements, personality, athletic coordination and overall performance. The routine may include aerobics, dance, gymnastics or other demonstrations of athletic talent with harmonized costume, music and choreography.

Men's Physique 🕞

In 2012 the Men's Physique division was officially launched as a new IFBB sport discipline. It proves to be a very popular category, so the IFBB has increased the number of Men's Physique categories from 2 (two) to 6 (six): 170 cm, 173 cm, 176 cm, 179 cm, 182 cm and over 182 cm. They perform two rounds of quarter turns, wearing board

shorts of their choice. The final round (Round 2) begins with a short individual onstage presentation of each competitor. It is aimed at men who do weight training, keep fit and eat a healthy balanced diet, but who prefer to develop a less muscular, yet athletic and aesthetically pleasing physique.

They are fit looking contestants who display proper shape and symmetry, combined with some muscularity and good overall condition. The athletes should have stage presence and poise and their personality and ability to present themselves onstage with confidence, should be visible.

In 2016 IFBB introduced one open category of Muscular Men's Physique intended for competitors with slightly bigger muscularity than accepted in the regular men's physique.




Women Bodyfitness

Bodyfitness has been implemented by the IFBB in 2002 to give a chance to compete for wide group of shapely women without the routine rounds, just the physique ones. This formula has proved to be useful and the number of participating competitors increases each year. Later on IFBB created for them the possibility to show their figure in motion during a short individual onstage presentation called "I-walking".

Currently, there are two rounds of quarter turns in the bikini-style costume of their own choice and classic stiletto pump of any color. At the beginning of Round 2 (finals) top 6 competitors perform individual "I-walking" presentations and

In all rounds judges should assess the overall athletic appearance of the physique, taking into account symmetrically developed physique, muscle tone and shape, with a small amount of body fat, as well as the hair, makeup and individual style of presentation, including personal confidence, poise and grace. This sport discipline is widely open for all wellshaped women working out in the fitness centers and following the healthy sport diet. And they take the advantage of it! Like in fitness, subscores from the final round are used to get the final total and places. There are four body height categories: 158 cm, 163 cm, 168 cm, and over 168 cm



Women's Bikini-Fitness 🕨

This category has been introduced in 2011 and is aimed at women who keep their body in shape and eat healthy. Overall body lines, balance and proportions, body tone and healthy appearance are taken into consideration. High-intensity weight training and hard, lean muscles are not necessary. The emphasis is on a well-shaped, fit, healthy and attractive appearance, similar to that of models.

Competitors are assessed in two rounds, wearing a two-piece bikini and high-heels. In both rounds, quarter-turns, including front, back and both sides stance, are performed. As well, the final round begins with "I-walking", which gives each competitor a chance to present her body and her charm on the move. This competition started with one open class and - due to the extreme popularity - expanded to eight body-height categories nowadays: 158 cm, 160 cm, 162 cm, 164 cm, 166 cm, 169 cm. 172 cm and over 172 cm.









Women's Fit Model

New IFBB sport, new possibilities, new challenge. This IFBB new sport discipline is intended to display the beauty of the human body in a bit different way than in already existing divisions. To create this possibility, an additional, new round was added in both men and women categories. combining sport qualities with elegance of moves, gestures and a kind of "showmanship", wearing non-sport attires. In women's categories it is an evening gown. The Fit-Model competitors must be viewed with the emphasis on a "healthy and balanced" physique, in an attractively presented, impressive "Total Package". Competitors must demonstrate their grace, poise, elegance and sophistication. The gown will.

In the first three rounds athletes wear a onepiece, tight-fitting swimsuit. This attire was specially selected to enable competitors to have a softer midsection, displaying rather attractive body lines and a bit of personality.

Judges should pay attention to the overall appearance of a competitor, the overall body development and shape, proportionally and symmetrically developed, complete physique, the hair and facial beauty, the athlete's ability to present herself with confidence, poise and grace and the general impression made by the competitor.

Children Fitness

Children Fitness is the only IFBB sports division available for children, with no lower age limit. The upper age limit is 16 years old. Then children move to the junior age division.

Children Fitness is one of the most beautiful categories, in a familiar environment, as it is mandatory for the athletes to have the mother (that is usually also an IFBB athlete), as the coach, and therefore IFBB Children Fitness events are a wonderful celebration, plenty of fitness lifestyle families, in which the kids, following the steps from their parents, start their sport carriers, to become later on the champions of the future.

The Children Fitness routine may be a demonstration of talent, personality, and athletic coordination.


Women's Physique 🕒

This IFBB division was introduced with the beginning of 2013 for women who want to prepare heavier, bodybuilding-style body but not extremely dried, lean and muscular, yet athletic and aesthetically pleasing. Altogether, there are 3 rounds. In round 1 (semi-finals) competitors' physiques and muscularity are assessed during quarter turns and four compulsory poses. In the finals compulsory poses and the posedown are performed in round 2 and a short, 30-second posing routine to music of competitor's choice in round 3.

This sport is placed somewhere between Bodyfitness and former Women Bodybuilding, which has been removed from the IFBB list of official

Competitors are expected to present the overall athletic development of the musculature but also balanced and symmetrical development of all muscle groups as well their sport condition and quality, with visible separation between them.

There are two categories in this division: up to 163 cm and over 163 cm.





Mixed Pairs



Mixed-Pairs was officially recognized as by the IFBB a sport discipline in 1983 as a bodybuilding mixed

Men from Mixed-Pairs perform mandatory poses in the same manner like in Men's Bodybuilding, while women perform these poses in the same style like in Women's Physique. Men competitors wear the same attire like in Men's Bodybuilding, women competitors wear the same attire like in Women's Physique.

Mixed Pairs competition consists of three rounds: Round 1 in the semifinals (comparisons) plus Round 2 (mandatory poses) and Round 3 (posing routine) in the finals.

In the Mixed Pairs category judges assess the overall physique of both partners for the degree of proportion, symmetry, muscle size and quality (density, separation) as well as skin tone. The couple will also be assessed as a unit with particular attention being given to how well their individual physiques complement each other and how well they move in unison.

In the routine round judges pay particular attention to how well each couple display their physiques to music. Judges will look for a smooth, artistic, and well-choreographed routines which may include any number of poses; however, the mandatory poses must be included. The couple must also include intermittent pauses so as to display the muscular development of their physique.





Classic Bodybuilding (*)

It is a version of bodybuilding for those male athletes who don't want to develop their muscles to their "extreme" full potentials but prefer lighter "classic" physique. To create the equal chances to them, the competitors' bodyweight is limited according to their body height, following the special IFBB formula for each body height category (currently there are five categories: 168 cm; 171 cm, 175 cm, 180 cm and over 180 cm).

Since muscle mass is limited, special attention is paid to the overall view of the physique, body proportions and lines, muscle shape and condition (density, bodyfat level, definition and details).

These values are assessed by the judges during Rounds 1 and 3. In Round 2, like in bodybuilding, free posing routines are performed to music of athlete's choice.



Bodybuilding

Athletes train to develop all bodyparts and muscles to maximum size but in balance and harmony. There should be no "weak points" or underdeveloped muscles. Moreover, they should follow a special pre-competition training cycle, to decrease the bodyfat level as low as possible and remove the underskin water to show the quality of muscles: density, separation and definition. Who can display more muscle details is scoring higher at the contest. And the other matter to be assessed is general view of the physique, which should be proportionally built. It means broad shoulders and narrow waist as well as adequately long legs and shorter upper body.

These qualities are displayed during two physique assessment rounds when competitors do 7 mandatory poses during comparisons of 3 to 8 athletes proposed by the judges. Athletes perform barefoot, in posing trunks. There are 7 bodyweight categories for men: 65 kg; 70 kg; 75 kg; 80 kg; 90 kg; 100 kg and over 100 kg.

There is also a routine round when athletes can show their physique during 60-second free posing routine performed to the music of their choice. It is an attractive, artistic presentation, including compulsory and noncompulsory poses and other type of movements. There are three rounds. In each round each panel judge must put the competitors in order, giving them individual places from the first to the last.

Classic Physique

This new concept in our Bodybuilding modalities is a different version of the Classic Bodybuilding. The relationship between height and weight is different, more kilos, and the criteria worths basically in the old, classic look. Even more, the attire is a retro style one, a short with a minimum long at the sides of 15 cms. Bodies must be classic V shape look, well proportionated, more artistic way to pose. The vacuum pose is the key pose in this division, where a tiny waist is very important in the total physique score. This sport division is growing in every contest under IFBB in despite of being born only months ago.

Classic Physique want to show again the classic look that in the 60's and 70's $\hfill \hfill \hfil$ years in the last century did famous our sport, Bodybuilding. In fact the competition system is doing two news poses; Vacuum pose; famous in the older era of 50's to 80's, the reason for this is easy; evoiding distended bellies and this movement is specially able to show who is the one with problems in this pose. The second new one pose is not only ONE pose, to the calling voice "your favorite classic pose" you can do whatever pose you consider to do, You can not repeat poses and you can not pose to the rear. This way the athlete is free to show his best side to the judges.

> Muscle size, classic physique look, tiny waist, rounded muscles, good shoulders and abdominals are the main weapons among the winners.





Games Classic Bodybuilding

Was introduced by the IFBB in 2016. It is intended for less muscular men, with smaller bodyweight limits, what is the only difference compared to Classic Bodybuilding. There are two categories in Men's Games Classic Bodybuilding: up to 175 cm and over 175 cm.

Wheelchair Bodybuilding

The IFBB wanted to create a division to enable male wheelchair users to compete in national and international events, including continental and World Championships.

Athletes train to develop all

upper body parts and muscles to maximum size but remaining in balance and harmony, avoiding "weak points" or underdeveloped muscles.

Preparing for a competition, they decrease their body fat level and remove the underskin water to show the quality of muscles: density, separation and definition.

They display muscles during seven mandatory poses as well as the posing routine which lasts 60 seconds. The athletes perform all rounds seated on the wheelchairs, wearing long pants and sport shoes.

Currently, one open category is performed.













OVERALL CHAMPION:



- Farshad Ganji (14 points)

▲The usual Iranian champions and the surprising Lithuanians dominated the overall competition, with tremendous equality between them. In the end, by just 1 point of advantage (11 to 12 points), one very young Karolis Linkevicius took the overall title, with an enormously aesthetic physique of 83 kilos, ahead of the almost 90 kilos of Mohammadebrahim Arzeshmand who had to settle for second place, after having been third in the overall in 2021.

BEST TEAM AWARD: IRAN

A total of 45 countries managed to put athletes in the finals and score in the team competition. Iran showed its enormous superiority in the men's classes yet another year. The national team revalidated its 2021 title and continues at the top of the medal table, where they've been since Marrakech 2013, with the sole exception of 2020, in the midst of the pandemic. Ukraine, despite the country's difficulties, once again became the best European team with a third place behind South Korea, only by 4 points.



Without the presence of the women's teams, the Master competition was based solely on the scores of the men's teams this time, providing a list of 41 countries that managed to place athletes in the finals.

Slovakia's team made an impressive leap from their 8th place finish in 2021 to claiming team victory, ahead of Romania who also improved their 3rd place from last year. The good work of these two sports federations was joined by that of Sweden, who was able to reach bronze, improving its 6th

place from 2021 and beating Spain by a short margin of 2 points. The Spanish federation also progressed from its 10th place in 2021, to a 4th place, ahead of Japan (5th, 2 points difference) and Egypt (6th with 7 points difference), the best non-European federations.

IFBB WORLD CHILDRENS FITNESS CHAMPIONSH



ON JUNE 16th-19th, 2023, all IFBB eyes were focused on Cacak, where the World Children Fitness Championships have been traditionally held. The IFBB President Santonja was present at the event which was perfectly organized by the Serbian National Federation chaired by Goran Ivanovic and supported by the Serbian Ministry of Sports. Children's and youth fitness continues to grow unstoppably, and the Serbian Federation plays a fundamental role in the worldwide development of the categories for young people, such as fitness and the new Fitness Challenge disciplines.

Over 300 participants and visitors from twelve National federations

spent an incredible and unforgettable weekend enjoying indoor and outdoor sports events.

The growing number of competitors every year shows that IFBB sports have their beginning in a family where the foundation of an athlete's future sports career is set.

The World Children Fitness Championships was a real success with so many talented young athletes competing. The judges were impressed by the stunning presentations of individual routines, unforgettable visual styles, high-level choreography, and aesthetical body lines of the young athletes.

Children were divided into categories by age and gender. At the same time, countries had a chance to demonstrate their skills and strengths in the Team Fitness category which has always been the most awaited and spectacular part of the competitions.

The best national team awards were divided between Hungary (1st place), Slovakia (2nd place), and Poland (3rd place).

The top winners in the fitness categories were the athletes from traditionally strong teams, such as Hungary, Slovakia, Turkey, and Poland.

This year, the teams of Romania, Mexico, and Serbia have joined the group of medalists which is proof that children's fitness is expanding worldwide.















X CENTRAL AMERICAN BODYBUILDING AND FITNESS CHAMPIONSHIP

THE X CENTRAL **AMERICAN** Bodybuilding

and Fitness Championship was held in San Salvador, El Salvador from May 26 to 28. It was organized by the Salvadoran Federation of Bodybuilding and Related Sports under the leadership of President Fabrizzio Hernandez.

The event was attended by the Central American countries: Guatemala, Honduras, Costa Rica, Nicaragua and the host El Salvador. It was held at the Teatro Presidente, a beautiful and appropriate facility for this type of event that has been used in previous years for other international championships.

Within the agenda, a seminar of regional and national judges was

speakers in the area such as Eng. Eduardo Abdalah, president of the Central American and Pan-American Confederation of Bodybuilding and Fitness, as well as international judge, Mr. Fabrizzio Hernandez international judge and the national speakers Lic. Melvin Zepeda and Rene Gálvez.

The final results within the competition placed Honduras as first place, El Salvador as runner-up and Nicaragua in third place. The presidents of Honduras and Costa Rica, Francis Lara Smart and Edgar Sánchez, were pleased with the development of the event. El Salvador enjoys being the safest country in the Americas and is a great enhancer of sport through future.

The championship was made possible due to the efforts of the

Salvadoran Federation before the National Institute of Sports (INDES), the Organizing Committee of the XXIV Central American and Caribbean Games (COSSAN) with the recognition of the Olympic Committee of El Salvador. The Salvadoran Federation of Bodybuilding and Related Sports is grateful for the leadership of national sports entities such as Lic. Yamil Bukele, president of INDES and COSSAN and Lic. Armando Bruni, president of COES.

During the event, Professor Rene Santos González received a recognition medal for his hard and long work with the FSFC. Alma Vásquez from Mexico also received a recognition medal for her support as an international judge, who was in charge of the technical











AFTER DIFFICULT TIME of

the Covid-19 pandemic, European physique sports fully "recovered", showing unexpected progress in popularity and attendance.

With 1,030 entries from 44 countries, it was the largest European Championships in history, with a slightly higher attendance than in 2018 and 2019, so before the Covid-19 pandemic. And it happened without national teams from Russia and Belarus, which - according to the

decision of the EFBB Executive Council - cannot participate in the European Championships (but can enter the World Championships). They usually registered an additional 150 or more athletes for continental championships.

Finland and France entered the biggest teams (80+) but most of the medals went to Romania, Spain and Ukraine. Taking into account previous years, these Championships took one day more and it was a perfect decision, enabling to finish the battle on the

stage well before midnight each day. European Fitness and Bodybuilding Federation (new name and logo!) headed by Dr. Rafael Santonja and Santa Susanna Mayor, Mr. Joan Campolier, did their best to create the best possible conditions for athletes, officials and spectators and they perfectly know how to do it and what is needed. Moreover, there was a very interesting Expo at the venue, with the biggest number of exhibitors ever seen at this event!

2023 EUROPEAN BODYBUILDING CHAMPIONSHIPS

All bodybuilding divisions have also fully "recovered" from the pandemic, showing significantly more athletes than in 2022. Three Overall titles went to Ukraine, two to Azerbaijan and one to Serbia, so athletes from Eastern Europe dominated this division. Despite so many titles in the Overall, Ukraine didn't win the Best Team Classification, taking 2nd place, just behind Spain, with a narrow distance of 3 points.

MUSCULAR MEN'S PHYSIQUE

For the first time two body height categories were included in the program as the result of the IFBB Rules changes. Azerbaijani athletes won this class in the past 2 years and they continued but with a new star, Hidayat Maharramli, who was at the top in his category (179 cm) and in the Overall, beating by 1 point (7:8) Turkish champion Yigit Unugur.







2023 EUROPEAN FITNESS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Commonly known as "The World Capital of Fitness", Santa Susanna hosted the best European senior, junior and masters athletes in all fitness divisions, included Women's and Men's Fit-Model for the first time, having previously a separate continental championships. This made the Fitness Championships more attractive and stylish, taking into account the final round in evening gowns. Half of the Overall titles went to the well-known, famous stars, current or former world title holders, like Aneta Ticha (Bikini), Kristina Juricova (Acrobatic Fitness), Michal Barbier (Men's Fitness) or Alla Matsehora (Bodyfitness). But others went to the young, rising stars like Nicol Celerikova (Artistic Fitness), Regina Mandrika (Fit-Model) or Malin Nilsson (Women's Physique). In the IFBB a fast rotation of the stars can be seen as many medal winners from the top international competitions have constantly been moving to the

Elite Pro division. Ukraine holds the Best Team title second time in a row, with Romania changing Finland in the 2nd position. Slovakia firmly remains in the 3rd place. 31 countries have been classified.

2023 EUROPEAN JUNIORS & MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Taking into account the number of categories, these are the biggest IFBB championships, with 19 Overall titles to be distributed among the bests. Also the number of participating athletes are usually the biggest. These European Championships attracted 177 juniors and 304 masters what gives 481 competitors in total. We have seen many multi medalists, who won medals in more than one category. For example, Siiri Mannerheimo (Finland) won Beginners Bikini class then Junior Bikini Overall title and silver medal in Senior Bikini. Very impressive achievements like for a beginner! Valeria Kopajeva (Estonia) won the Junior Artistic Fitness Overall title as well as two bronze medals in senior classes (Artistic Fitness + Bikini). This is an example of a successful crossover. Nonna Prokopjuk (Estonia) won 2 gold medals (in senior and master Bikini + Overall). Oumar Sylla (Belgium) was the only champion who won the Overall title 2 years in a row (in Junior Men's Classic Physique), adding silver medal in senior category. Dragos Enuta (Romania) won 2 Overall titles in different masters divisions: Classic Bodybuilding and Games Classic Bodybuilding. Extraordinary achievement! But no one could sur Ukrainian Bodyfitness star Alla Matsehora who won Overall titles in senior and masters Bodyfitness!

Many Bikini juniors were also very successful among seniors, what is only an evidence of their top sport quality. And some results may be really astonishing. Most impressive examples: further senior Bikini Overall Champion, Aneta Ticha (Slovakia) lost by 1 point to Linn Von Bar (Sweden), who later on won senior over 172 cm class. 2022 Junior Bikini European Overall winner Viktorija Volodkovic (Lithuania) lost to the new Estonian star Elisabeth Atamanski. Finally, the Overall title went to 20-years-old Siiri Mannerheimo of Finland (later on won silver medal among seniors). In general, juniors were amazing and played an important role in battles against top seniors. This is only possible in a division where muscle development played a secondary role but overall body lines being the key factor of assessment.



Overall, the Syrian winner of up to 180 cm, Mohammad Al

Rafai, was the fair winner. In 65 kilo Bodybuilding, the competitor from Oman, Sami Khalifa Hasan taught us all that the issue of weight has nothing to do with what you do with it. Very few physiques like this were seen in Damascus: legs to dream of, small waist, excellent V shape, yet big and proportionate, he left no one in any doubt who was going to

win. In 70 kilos, the athlete from Bahrain Ahmed Ebrahim Alsayyad was the one who took the gold. At 75 kilos and coming from UAE, Ahmad Ali Mohammed Mulla did not have an easy time at all in this tough category. In less than 80 kilos, another UAE representative, Ahmed Rustom, also won unanimously thanks to his structure, leg size, body shape, big arms and excellent pose. In less than 85 kilos, the

athlete from Oman Ali Salim Ali Al Mamari won and convinced; it was impossible to be bigger at his height and those 85 kilos did not give an inch of margin to his opponents, so much so that he won the overall title. At less than 90 kilos, the beautiful shape and muscular quality and separation of the Bahraini Muslem Abdulla Ali made him win the gold fairly. In less than 95 kilos, the representative of Iran, Hossein Pashazaedegh,

won, although he did not have an easy time against his rival from Oman, Mohammed Ali Alajmi, who with his superb condition only left room for the Persian to beat him fairly. At more than 95 kilos, the other Iranian Mohamed Reza Tayebi, with 118 kg on the scale, did not give anyone room to discussing the title, tall but with a lot of size (and well proportioned), only in the definition he did not go to the maximum.









The Wellness division, which is always spectacular in America, was a quality show due to the good number of athletes and the completeness of their physiques. The representative of Antigua & Barbuda Ahjanya King imposed her law, without a doubt flaunting the best definition of the entire division, but just within the parameters of Wellness. With an adequate muscle size in both legs and buttocks, she was invincible.

The overall victory of Men's Physique was for the representative of the Bahamas, Terrion Kemp, who was also the winner of the Junior Men's Physique. However, it didn't seem so clear in his fight against the representative of Guyana Emmerson Campbell, who appeared with a resounding physique, some good abs and very good aesthetics. Terrion, on his side, presented a very tall $\,$ physique with a very small waist and correct size, adequate definition and, above all, a lively and brave pose for a boy of Junior age. So, he ended up as the winner of the overall Men's Physique.

Zairelys Gomez from Venezuela was the overall Bikini champion, another discipline that was certainly not easy at all, but her physique stood out for her balance, pose and correct condition. The most numerous of all women's divisions and with increasing quality every year in this region, Bikini does not stop growing throughout the world. In Bodybuilding, we had the surprise of seeing the most numerous of all the male divisions. The overall winner, Mexican Josué Mata Mendes, is a compendium of what Bodybuilding should be: full size, but with excellent rippedness and great muscular balance along with a powerful frame and good pose. When all of these qualities come together, it's almost impossible to beat.

Francis Nanaberg and Christopher Nton from Ghana emerged as winners in the Classic Physique and Men's Physique categories respectively.



As for the competition, we can review the classes that met with the Juniors in Classic Physique, both coming from Syria and with a fairly even competitive level between the two, although it was Mohamad Ali Khatib who beat his compatriot, Saad Abdul Moez Tenkw. In the Master Classic Physique it was another Physique it was another Syrian, Mahmoud Cheghri, who won thanks to his complete physique, with good shape and being a good poser, against the

Iraqi Ameer Saeb Abdulameer and the UAE resident Prasanna Perera. 





As regards the sporting aspect, we'd like to highlight



The master women's bikini class was one of the most numerous, with a tough semifinal, after which she won gold and the subsequent Elite Pro Card Bogdana Bashta from the Czech Republic. The silver went to Renata Cerniauske from Lithuania (she also achieved the Elite Pro card) and the bronze to the Spanish representative Jasmin Ecker.

Another of the most numerous classes was that of master men's Bodybuilding. In it, the Lithuanian Andrius Talacka beat the Spaniards Jorge Fernández and Lorenzo Fernández after a tough fight for victory.

In the junior men's Bodybuilding class the victory went to Ales Cebin from Slovenia.

In men's classic Bodybuilding, Pavel Samek from the Czech Republic beat Adam Huserka (Slovakia) with Petr Jach from the Czech Republic taking bronze.

The women's Physique class left a clear winner in the figure of Eva Synkova, followed by Lucie Jakesova and Milena Koudelkova, all of them from the Czech Republic.

The fit model discipline was also present at Mr. Universe in Prague. Gold went to Veronika Vaskova of Slovakia, silver to Inna Novosad of the Czech Republic and bronze to Petra Jandova of Slovakia.
